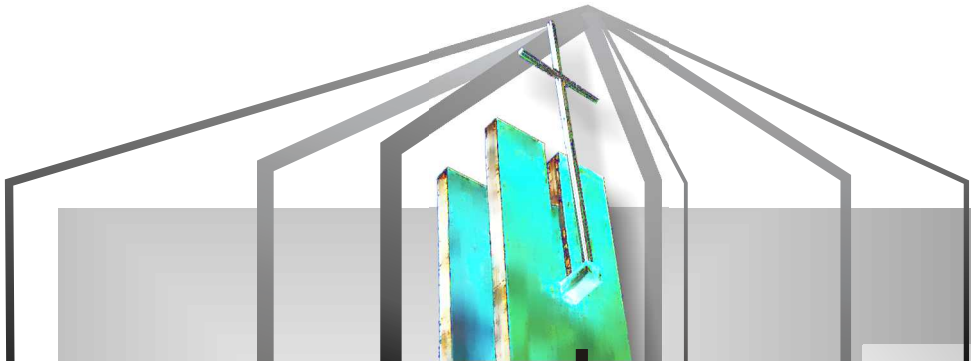

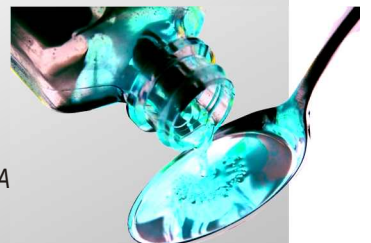

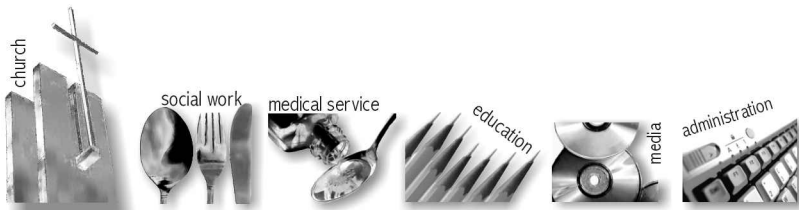

We hope this "Annual Report 2000" will be an encouragement to everyone reading it, to go on serving the people and country of Albania.

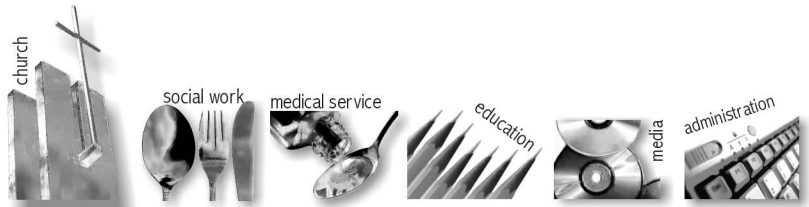

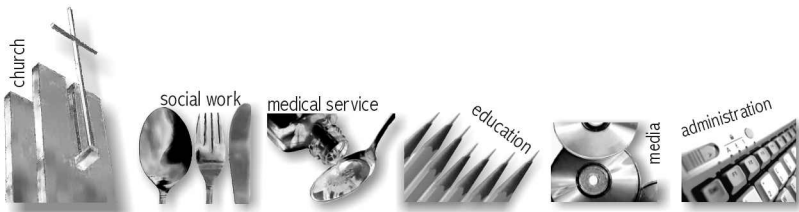

HISTORY

Fondacioni NEHEMIA took its name from the Biblical prophet Nehemiah, who lived about 450 years before Christ. He helped to build up his country by working in the spiritual and practical realms.

The German "Nehemia Christian Aid Ministries" has been working in Albania since 1991.

Our first transport with relief aid in 1991 was welcomed personally by the Albanian Minister of Health as the very first transport of this kind in Albania.

Since spring 1992 co-workers of NEHEMIA have been continuously working in Albania, mainly in Pogradec and Durrës.

In addition to the church many projects and work branches were established during the following five years, such as a dental clinic, soup kitchen, bakery, Bible school, clinic, carpentry etc. We also started to work continuously in Gjirokastër and Durrës.

During the unrest in March 1997 the premises and projects of NEHEMIA Pogradec were completely destroyed. Nevertheless all our missionaries remained in country and started to rebuild. Many social activities have been started again, new projects have been established.

In June 1998 the inauguration of our new NEHEMIA Center in Pogradec took place.

From March until July 1999 NEHEMIA, in close cooperation with other mission organizations, cared for thousands of refugees from Kosova.

Last year we purchased two buildings in Durrës for a local base.

In 2000 we also purchased a building and land in the village of Buçimas (close to Pogradec). There our new NEHEMIA Center (church, administration, guests, media), the NEHEMIA Education Center (school: grades 1-12, kindergarten) and a multi-purpose hall will be built (see p. 22).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Fondazioni NEHEMIA is almost exclusively financed by voluntary donations*.

Most of our funds we receive through our bases in Germany and Switzerland,

> "Nehemia Christenhilfsdienst e.V." and "AVC" (Aktionskomitee für verfolgte Christen) in Nidda/Germany

> "AVC Hilfswerk", Safnern, Switzerland,

who either receive designated (restricted) donations for specific projects, or general funds, mostly from Christians in Germany and Switzerland.

NEHEMIA/AVC in Germany has the right to issue tax reducible receipts for donations.

Special work branches are financed by our members CHW, MNA, AC and CfN.

** During the Kosova refugee crisis in 1999 we also received funds from the German government and other NGO's.*

Few of our projects are designed to cover a part of the needed funds by own income, for example by nominal fees for the school.

DONORS

Several projects are generously supported by private donors or churches in Germany or Switzerland, some of them are even completely covered by regular donations.

The financial commitment to running projects gives us a lot of security for future plans and is an enormous help for our work.

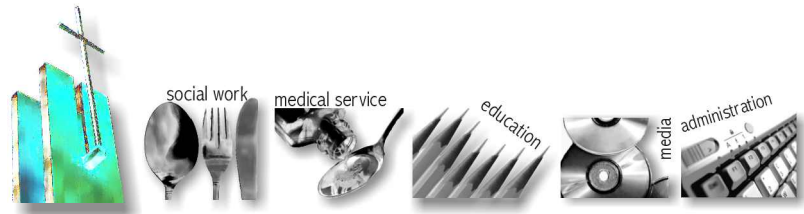

We also want to assist and help churches in neighboring countries, like in Greece, Macedonia and Kosova.

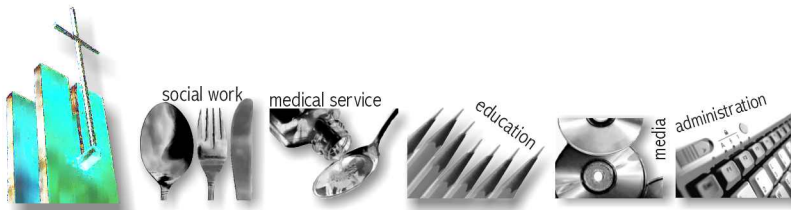

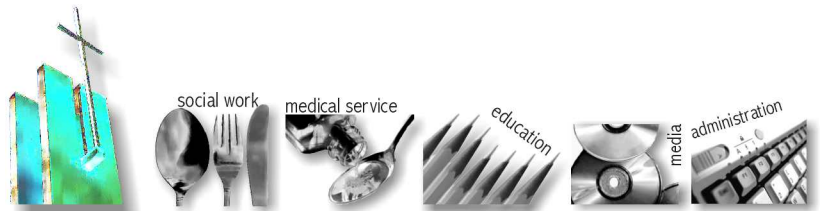

They also lead a dormitory for children of a remote village (see p. 17), and are distributing relief aid (p. 13) 'CHW works in cooperation with the United Methodist Church.

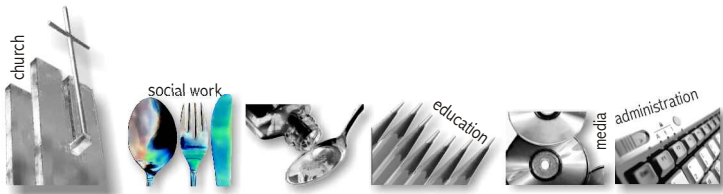

RELIEF AID FOR PEOPLE IN NEED

since 1991

Humanitarian Aid for people in need - that is traditionally one of NEHEMIA's first concerns - an opportunity to show "God's love in action".

NEHEMIA's activities in Albania started with a relief transport in 1991, which was welcomed by the Albanian Minister of Health personally as the first one of this kind in Albania.

Today there is still a lot of work to be done to relieve the immediate needs of poor people. Many families are living close to subsistence level, not being able to cover the most urgent needs.

We help in different projects:

- > Soup kitchen
- > Distribution of food
- > Distribution of clothes
- > Financial help for emergency cases
- > Support for medical treatment

Since 1991 more than 80.000 family parcels have been distributed.

SUPPORT FOR INSTITUTIONS

since 1991

Not only private individuals, but also authorities, public institutions and other organizations ask for support.

Over the years many vehicles, computers, copy machines, typewriters etc. have been donated to the local authorities.

Hospitals received medicine, surgical tools and medical equipment.

Many schools have been renovated and received furniture and writing materials.

For the retirement home in Gjirokaštër we have a special support program.

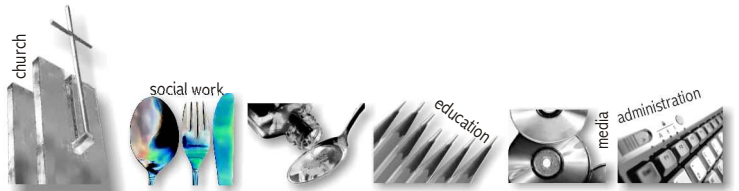

Support of the **RETIREMENT HOME** *in Gjirokastër*

Retirement homes are not very common institutions in Albania. Traditionally the families care for their elderly people, and it is considered a shame to leave them to the care of others. Unfortunately these traditions dissolve more and more, and many people ask for a place to spend the old age in a retirement home. The retirement home in Gjirokastër is also a home for several young disabled people - the only place for them to stay.

Like in most of the public institutions in Albania, there are only basic funds available to run the institution. By financial, spiritual and organizational support, Nehemia helps to improve the living conditions for the elderly people there. To provide old age in dignity.

SOUP KITCHEN

in Pogradec

The soup kitchen in Pogradec has existed since 1992, with only a short interruption of the work during the unrest of 1997, when the existing premises were destroyed during the nationwide unrest. Since several years the work has been fully financed by a church in Germany, the "Jesus Gemeinde Sohland".

Here children from extremely poor families and orphans receive not only a daily meal, but also medical and dental treatment, lessons in hygiene, small presents from time to time. Bible lessons, songs and prayers bring light into their hard lives.

Until summer 2000 most of the children attended our "Classes of Hope" - a special education program which has been taken over by Youth With A Mission, who also started a lunch program for their students. Responding to the smaller number of children fed by the soup kitchen NEHEMIA intensified the distribution of food for needy families, and will re-structure the work of the soup kitchen.

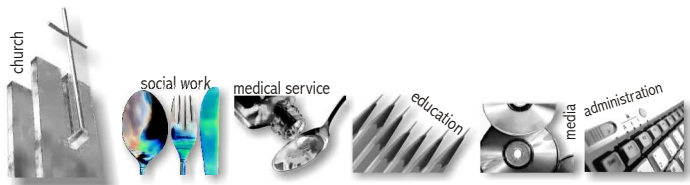

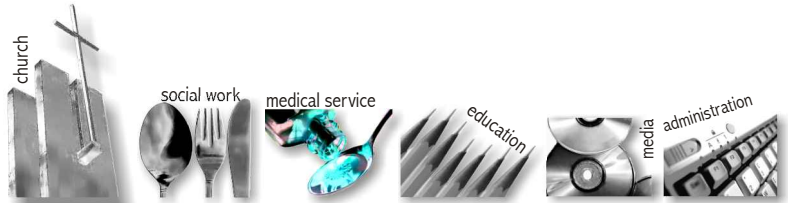

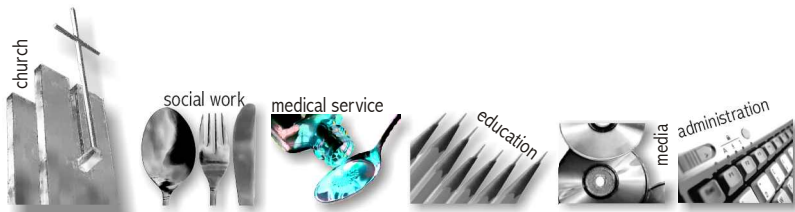
BACKGROUND

OUTPATIENT'S CLINIC

In the outpatients' clinic in NEHEMIA Center Pogradec two doctors examine and treat patients free of cost. Two nurses care for patients with minor wounds and the registration of the patients. Our medical personnel is on call for emergency cases in our private school and other work branches.

The clinic is equipped with an ultrasound scanner and an electrocardiogram.

In 2000 on average 20 patients daily received examinations and treatment. 980 patients are registered in the NEHEMIA clinic, most of them repeatedly visited our doctors.

120 children from the NEHEMIA school and kindergarten saw the doctor during the year.

The clinic is also the base and organizational center for outreaches of German medical teams. German doctors see patients there. In 2000 all of the students (231 children) got medical check-ups.

Due to organizational reasons the clinic had to be closed for several weeks during fall 2000 (September - October 2000). During this time only our patients with chronic diseases got treatment.

OUTREACHES 2000

Medical teams:

22 co-workers from Germany and Switzerland formed four medical teams (doctors and nurses) and examined and treated patients in two week outreaches:

- in the retirement home and church in Gjirokastër
- in the outpatient's clinic in Pogradec
- in villages near Pogradec (8 outreaches) where 400 patients have been treated

- co-workers of NEHEMIA and other mission organizations

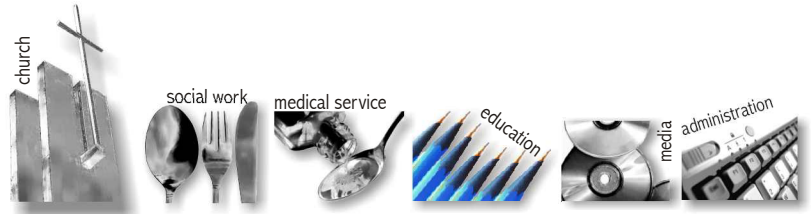

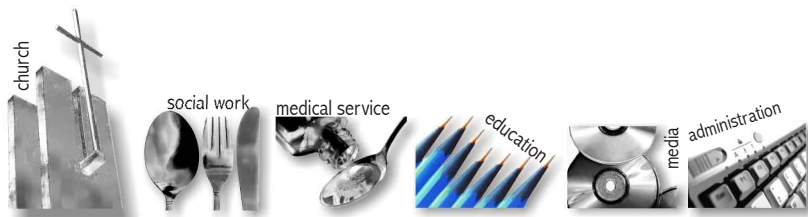

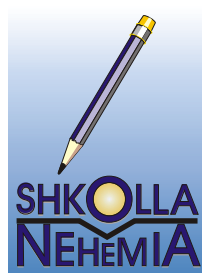

PRIVATE SCHOOL

Nehemia private school is very well accepted by the people of Pogradec and beyond, which is documented by the big number of applicants every year. By means of an individual test only about 30 percent of the children applying are chosen to attend Nehemia school.

The main reason for this limitation is simply: Space. In NEHEMIA center there are no more rooms left, which could serve as classrooms.

Therefore we are forced to build new premises. A big education center is planned in Buçimas, close to the city of Pogradec (see page 22).

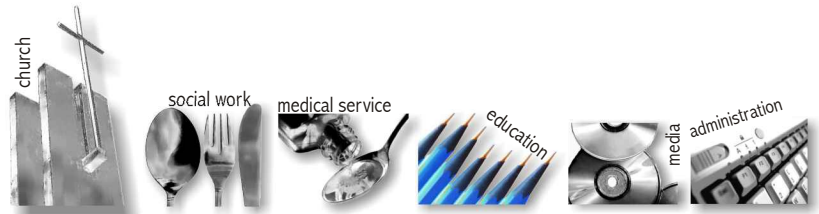

DAY CARE CENTER

in Nishtulla/Durrës:

In Nishtulla live many Gypsy families. The social surrounding makes it impossible for children to receive proper education. Missing patterns of social behavior, poverty, and a lack of support from the family are some of the reasons, why many children have problems to attend public schools.

NEHEMIA saw the need, and started a day care program for those children in 1999.

This is a problem especially for the school, which expands more and more.

At the end of 2000 / beginning of 2001 NEHEMIA purchased a big plot of land and a building in Buçimas, a village close to the city of Pogradec.

Here we plan to build a new center, which will be made up of three parts:

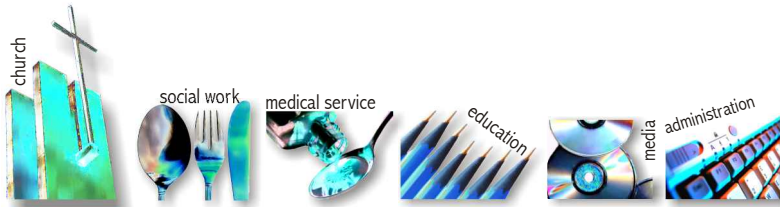

Of course, we also owe our donors and supporters insight into the financial reports. They are, after all, the source for our finances and enable us to run our various projects.

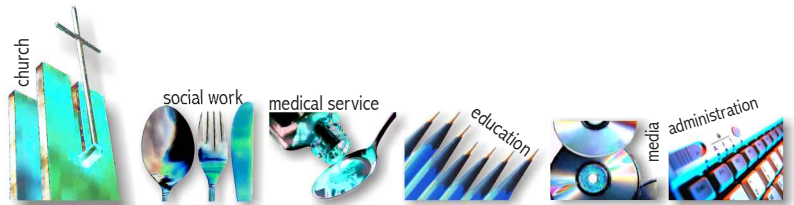
Continuously we try to improve bookkeeping and financial reports by further education of the staff, use of up-to-date software etc.

Independent Auditor's Report

To General Assembly
Nehemia Albania

We have audited the accompanying statement of financial position of Nehemia Albania as of 31 December 2000, and the related statements of activities for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of Nehemia Albania's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Due to time and personnel limitations, we were unable to visit remote branch offices or verify remote cash balances. Because of these limitations, we were also unable to verify certain fixed asset and humanitarian aid inventory amounts and existence.

In our opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had we been able to visit the remote offices or verify certain asset balances, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Nehemia Albania as of 31 December 2000, and the changes in its net assets for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.
